

**NOTICE TO BIDDERS
PARROTT MILL PUMP STATION UPGRADES
BOROUGH OF CHATHAM**

Notice is hereby given that sealed proposals will be received by the Borough of Chatham, Morris County, New Jersey for the **Parrott Mill Pump Station Upgrades** and be opened and read in public at the Borough of Chatham Municipal Building, 54 Fairmount Avenue, Chatham, NJ 07928 on **Tuesday, August 17, 2021 at 11:00 A.M.** prevailing time.

All work on this contract shall be completed within one hundred and fifty (150) calendar days following the Notice to Proceed.

The work of this Contract includes the demolition of the existing ejector station and installation of a new wet well mounted pump station on the existing drywell and associated piping work and electrical work.

Contract Documents for the proposed work, which have been prepared by the John J. McKelvey, P.E., of the firm Colliers Engineering & Design, Inc., are available at the office of said Engineer at 331 Newman Springs Road, Suite 203, Red Bank, New Jersey, and may be inspected by prospective bidders during business hours.

Bidders will be furnished with a copy of the Contract Documents by request upon proper notice and payment of a non-refundable charge of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) payable to Colliers Engineering & Design to defray the cost thereof. The contract documents are not available in electronic format.

Proposals must be made on the standard Proposal Forms in the manner designated in the Contract Documents, must be enclosed in sealed envelopes bearing the name and address of the bidder, and the name of the work on the outside; addressed to **Vincent DeNave, Borough Engineer, Borough of Chatham Municipal Building, 54 Fairmount Avenue, Chatham, NJ 07928.** All bids will be publicly opened and read in the Borough Municipal Building, 54 Fairmount Avenue, Chatham, NJ 07928 on the date and time mentioned above.

Bidders are solely responsible for the timely delivery of the bid and no bids shall be considered that are presented after the public call for receiving bids. Any bid received after the date and time specified will be returned, unopened, to the bidder. Bids must be based upon and in strict accordance with the Bid Specifications. Nonresponsive bids will be rejected.

No bid may be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days after the date set for the opening of the bids.

The bid shall be accompanied by a statement of Consent of Surety from a surety company authorized to do business in the State of New Jersey and acceptable to the Borough and either a Bid Bond or a Certified Check drawn to the order of Treasurer of the Borough of Chatham for not less than ten percent (10%) of the amount bid, except that the check need not exceed \$20,000.00. The successful bidder is hereby notified that a performance bond for the full amount of the project is required.

The award of the contract for this project will not be made until the necessary funds have been provided by the Borough of Chatham in a lawful manner.

The right is also reserved to reject any or all bids or to waive any informalities where such informality is not detrimental to the best interest of the Borough of Chatham. The right is also reserved to increase or decrease the quantities specified in the manner designated in the Specifications.

The successful bidder shall be required to comply with the following:

- A. Affirmative Action requirements (P.L. 1975, C.127, N.J.S.A. 10:5-1 et. seq.).
- B. The provisions of the New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act (N.J.S.A. 34:11-56.25 et. seq.).
- C. Anti-Kickback Regulations under Section 2 of the Act of June 13, 1934, known as the Copeland Act.
- D. Worker and Community Right-to-Know Act (N.J.S.A. 34:5A-1).

Moreover, the bid must be accompanied by a list of names and addresses of all stockholders owning 10% or more of the stock in accordance with the provisions of the Public Disclosure Law (P.L. 1988, C.33, N.J.S.A. 52:25-24.2).
