RESOLUTION #18-252

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A CONTRACT FOR THE 2018 ROAD MICRO-SURFACING PROGRAM TO ASPHALT PAVING SYSTEMS

WHEREAS, in accordance with N.J.S.A 40A:11-12 of the Local Public Contracts Law, public bids are not required when the purchase of goods or services is made through a cooperative purchasing program; and

WHEREAS, bid specifications for the 2018 Road Micro-Surfacing Project were prepared by the City of Summit, acting as the lead agency in the Summit City Cooperative Pricing System #192SCCPS ("SCCPS"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Chatham is a member of SCCPS and realizes cost savings by purchasing services, equipment and materials through SCCPS; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works recommends that the purchase of goods and services for the 2018 Road Micro-Surfacing Program be made through SCCPS to Asphalt Paving Systems, PO Box 530, Hammonton, NJ 08037 at the price of \$2.69 per square yard for a total cost in amount not to exceed \$65,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that the maximum dollar amount of the contract shall not exceed \$65,000.00 and that funds are currently available for the purpose of awarding the contract and shall be encumbered from Capital Account #C-04-55-918-004.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham that it concurs with the recommendation of the Director of Public Works and hereby authorizes an award of contract to Asphalt Paving Systems, in accordance with the specifications upon which bids were received and accepted by SCCPS, in the amount not to exceed \$65,000.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, all other Borough officials and employees are hereby authorized and directed to take all action necessary and appropriate to effectuate the terms of this Resolution.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A CONTRACT TO M. SKY CONSTRUCTION CORPORATION FOR THE 2018 SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer solicited proposals from qualified contractors for the 2018 Sidewalk Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the following two (2) quotations were received:

WHEREAS, this contract is awarded as a non-fair and open contract pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4; and

WHEREAS, the Qualified Purchasing Agent has reviewed and approved the quotation specification and has reviewed all quotes that were received with the Chief Financial Officer; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer recommends that an award of the contract be made to M. Sky Construction Corporation, 830 Route 15 South, Lake Hopatcong, NJ 07849 in the amount of \$35,115.00; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that the maximum dollar amount of the contract shall not exceed \$35,115.00 and that funds are currently available for the purpose of awarding this contract from General Capital Account #C-04-55-918-003.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham that they hereby authorize the Mayor to execute the contract with M. Sky Construction Corporation in the amount of \$35,115.00, in accordance with the specifications upon which quotations were received and accepted; and

WHEREAS, each year the Borough of Chatham realizes cost savings by purchasing equipment and materials through cooperative pricing systems; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Chatham desires to participate in the Sourcewell cooperative purchasing system ("Sourcewell"), formerly known as the National Joint Powers Alliance Cooperative.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham that they do hereby authorize participation in Sourcewell for the year 2018; and

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A MORRIS COUNTY TRAIL CONSTRUCTION GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE PASSAIC RIVER TRAIL PROJECT [A PORTION OF THE HISTORIC RIVERSIDE TRAIL – WATCHUNG AVENUE TO STANLEY PARK]

WHEREAS, the Borough of Chatham is desirous of submitting a Morris County Trail Construction Grant Program application for the construction of the Passaic River Trail Project; and

WHEREAS, trail project entails constructing a trail from Watchung Avenue to Stanley Park following the Passaic River; and

WHEREAS, the Morris County Trail Construction Grant Program is a reimbursable grant program requiring municipalities to fund its proposed trail project(s) upfront; and

WHEREAS, if the Morris County Park Commission approves the grant, the Chief Financial Officer has confirmed that sufficient funds will be included in the 2019 Capital Budget submission for Borough Council approval; and

WHEREAS, the Trail Construction Grant Application must be submitted to the Morris County Park Commission on or before July 31, 2018.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Borough of Chatham that they hereby authorize the Mayor to execute a Morris County Trail Construction Grant Program application for the construction of the Passaic River Trail Project as herein referenced; and
