- Highest traffic times are spring and fall.


• Beautifully

Garden Park Pollinator Garden

The Brief

- Create a garden for pollinators next to a new stone landing near the Middle School playing fields
- The planting should also help define the space of the new landing to encourage use

Considerations

- Landing in middle of playing fields
- Most pollinators are latebloomers
- Need structure to carry through the winter

The Design

- Creates a space with plants, adding height at the back to orient people.
- Four season: Plants with winter interest chosen for their structure
- Double duty: Plants chosen for long bloom times.
