# **CELEBRATING ARBOR DAY ON APRIL 24, 2015**

**WHEREAS**, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

**WHEREAS**, this special day, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in the State of Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world each year; and

WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, trees also increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of our business areas, and beautify our community; and

WHEREAS, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.

**BE IT RESOLVED**, I, Bruce A. Harris, Mayor of the Borough of Chatham, together with the Borough Council, do hereby proclaim April 24, 2015 ARBOR DAY in the Borough of Chatham and encourage all citizens to join together to celebrate the benefits of community trees and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands for the well-being of present and future generations.

#### **RESOLUTION #15-159**

### **RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE**

**WHEREAS,** this year, 2015, marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the beginning of the historic episode referred to as the Armenian Genocide; and

**WHEREAS,** the Armenian Genocide, which spanned the period from April 1915, and continued through 1923, during World War I and its aftermath, resulted in approximately 1.5 million Armenians perishing in their ancestral lands of Asia Minor and while fleeing from those lands as the Ottoman Empire collasped; and

WHEREAS, the Armenian Genocide is one of the many episodes in mankind's history of violence against an ethnic minority; and

WHEREAS, many of those who survived the Armenian Genocide did so with the assistance of courageous, defiant and selfless people within Asia Minor and elsewhere in the Middle East, in Europe and beyond; and

WHEREAS, many survivors found safe haven in the United States of America, which opened its arms and raised its lantern with the proclamation, "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free"; and

WHEREAS, Armenians, in the light of Aremenian freedom, settled and built families in the United States of America and today, cherishing the opportunities afforded by our great nation, thrive in myriad occupations and positions of leadership in our communities, business, government and institutions; and

**BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Mayor and Borough Council that they hereby encourage residents of Chatham Borough to honor Friday, April 24, 2015 as "Armenian Genocide Remembrance Day"; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that we honor the memory and legacy of those who perished in the Armenian Genocide one century ago; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that we make this commemoration an opportunity for all of us not to turn a blind eye to genocide, a scourge that has not yet been stopped.
