NATIONAL BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH - OCTOBER 2015

WHEREAS, October is *National Breast Cancer Awareness Month*, which is an annual campaign to increase awareness of this disease; and

RESOLUTION #15-302

RESOLUTION APPOINTING JOSEPH GONSALVES TO THE MAYORS' WELLNESS COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, Resolution #15-25, adopted by the Borough Council on January 5, 2015, re-established the Mayors' Wellness Advisory Committee, a joint committee with Chatham Township to work with Mayors and key leaders to shape healthier lifestyles for the men, women and children in our communities; and

WHEREAS, Joseph Gonsalves has expressed interest in being appointed to Mayors' Wellness Advisory Committee and has submitted a Volunteer Application to the Mayor and Borough Council for consideration; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Chatham has a need to purchase a self-propelled stump grinder; and

WHEREAS, the Deputy Director of Public Works prepared bid specifications for the purchase of one (1) 2015 Bandit Self-Propelled Stump Grinder Model 2650 SP or approved equal; and

WHEREAS, sealed bid proposals were received from four (4) bidders as follows:

WHEREAS, the Deputy Director of Public Works has reviewed all bid proposals and recommends that the award of the contract be made Northeastern Arbor Supply, 50 Notch Road, Woodland Park, NJ 07424 in the amount of \$46,796.00; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has confirmed that sufficient funds are available in Current Fund Account # C-04-55-915-603 for the award of this contract.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Chatham that it concurs with the recommendation of the Deputy Director of Public Works and hereby authorizes the Mayor to execute the contract with Northeastern Arbor Supply, in the amount of \$46,796.00, in accordance with the specifications upon which quotations were received and accepted; and

RESOLUTION #15-304

RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT TO THE MUNICIPAL SHARED SERVICES DEFENSE AGREEMENT (“MSSDA”)

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Chatham entered into the Municipal Shared Services Defense Agreement (“MSSDA”) for the purpose as set forth therein, which included retaining a common expert in the Declaratory Judgment action that was filed on behalf of the Borough in accordance with In the Matter of the Adoption of N.J.A.C. 5:96 and 5:97 by the New Jersey Council on Affordable Housing, 221 N.J. 1 (2015) (“Decision”); and

WHEREAS, the MSSDA identified Dr. Robert Burchell, a distinguished professor at Rutgers University, as the expert to be retained; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Burchell became ill and has been unable to complete the obligations under the Research Agreement as set forth in the MSSDA; and

WHEREAS, as a result, Rutgers University has exercised its right to terminate the Research Agreement as permitted under its terms; and

WHEREAS, the MSSDA requires modification to allow the members to retain one or more alternative experts, consultants and/or other professionals for the Litigation; and

WHEREAS, an Amendment to the MSSDA ("Amendment") has been prepared to effectuate the modification; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Chatham recognize that the Declaratory Judgment action requires immediate action and may require further expedited actions by its counsel determined to be necessary and appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Chatham have determined that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the Borough of Chatham to approve the Amendment, and/or to affirm and ratify the Amendment, and to authorize their designated counsel to take actions on behalf of the municipality with regard to the multiplicity of issues raised and associated with the continued implementation of the MSSDA.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Chatham that the terms and conditions of the Amendment to MSSDA are hereby approved, and/or ratified and confirmed and that the Mayor and Borough Clerk be and are hereby authorized to execute the Amendment. Alternatively, the Mayor and Borough Council hereby approve and ratify all prior actions to negotiate and execute the Amendment taken prior to the date of this Resolution by the Borough Attorney and other Borough officials; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Chatham as follows:

1. The terms and conditions of the Amendment to MSSDA attached hereto are hereby approved, and/or ratified and confirmed.
2. The Mayor and Borough Clerk be and are hereby authorized to execute the aforesaid Amendment. Alternatively, the Mayor and Borough Council hereby approve and ratify all prior actions to negotiate and execute the Amendment taken prior to the date of this Resolution by the Borough Attorney and other Borough officials.
3. The Mayor and Borough Council hereby authorize Jeffrey R. Surenian, Esq. to execute an agreement on behalf of the Borough of Chatham with Econsult Solutions, Inc.
The Mayor and Borough Council hereby authorize Jeffrey R. Surenian, Esq. to execute on behalf of the Borough of Chatham, with the approval of the Borough's designated counsel, such other agreement(s) as are advisable to effectuate the purposes of the MSSDA as amended.
4. The Mayor and Borough Council further authorize their designated counsel to approve such other changes to the MSSDA as may be necessary to effectuate its purposes, and to take action on behalf of the municipality with regard to the multiplicity of issues raised and associated with the implementation of the MSSDA, provided that the action will not require the municipality to appropriate and commit any additional funding for the MSSDA.
In the event such changes and actions require the municipality to appropriate and commit any additional funding for the MSSDA, the Borough of Chatham shall only be responsible for such funding if it authorizes same.
5. If additional monies are needed to effectuate the intent and purpose of the MSSDA, no such services shall be authorized by designated counsel without further action from the Borough of Chatham.
6. All Borough officials are hereby authorized and directed to take all action necessary and appropriate to effectuate the terms of this Resolution.

7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
