**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Chatham Office of Emergency Management (OEM) is responsible for providing the Borough with mitigation, preparedness, response, recovery, and coordination for public emergencies; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Borough Council wish to approve the appointment of said volunteers by the OEM Coordinator in consultation with the Mayor and Borough Administrator; and

**WHEREAS,** said volunteers shall perform such duties as directed by the OEM Coordinator; and

**WHEREAS**, in approving the appointment of said volunteers, it is the Borough Council's understanding that said volunteers will be covered by the Borough's workers' compensation coverage.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Chatham, in the County of Morris and the State of New Jersey that the OEM Coordinator, in consultation with the Mayor and Borough Administrator, is hereby authorized to appoint volunteers to help respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in the Borough. Said volunteers shall perform such duties as directed by the OEM Coordinator.

# RESOLUTION APPOINTING POLICE CHAPLAINS TO THE BOROUGH OF CHATHAM POLICE DEPARTMENT

**WHEREAS,** Reverend Jeffrey Peter Markay of Chatham United Methodist Church and Reverend Alton Craig Dunn of First Baptist Church of Madison are ordained clergy persons in good standing and have the desire to volunteer their services, without pay, to serve as Police Chaplains within the Borough of Chatham; and

**WHEREAS,** Police Chaplains will serve an invaluable service to the Chatham Borough Police Department and to the Chatham Borough Community by helping the Borough of Chatham Police Officers in discharging their duties, including but limited to, death notifications, stationhouse adjustments and other duties;
